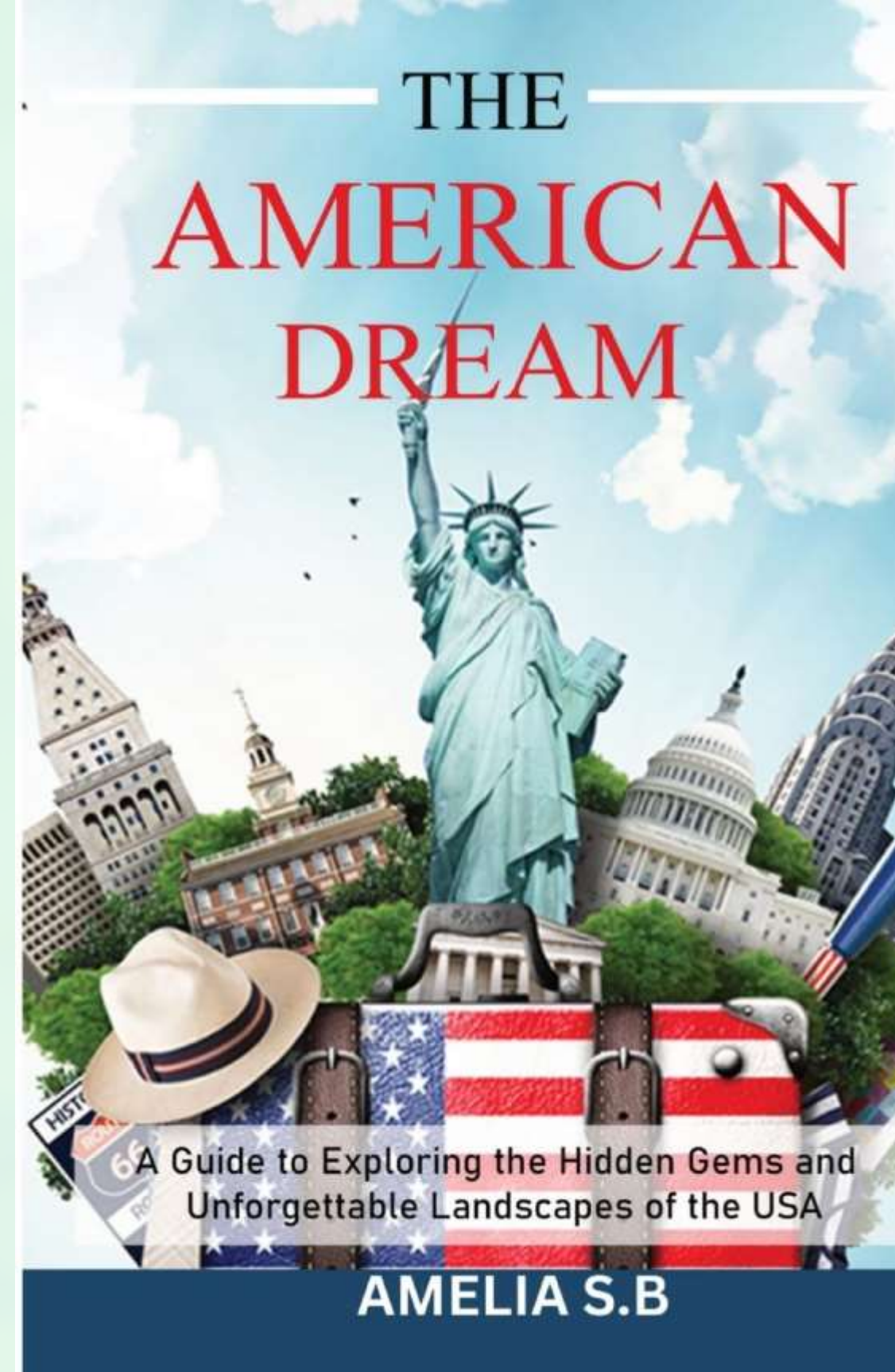

Between Regions

Amtrak Trains: Scenic and comfortable for regional travel. The Northeast Corridor connects NYC to Washington, D.C. in just 3 hours.

Buses: Budget-friendly option for nearby cities with companies like Greyhound and Megabus.

Within Cities

Subway Systems: New York's extensive underground network is the fastest way to navigate the city. Purchase a MetroCard for unlimited rides.

Ride-Share Services: Uber and Lyft are convenient for airport transfers and late-night travel when public transit is limited.

Taxis: Iconic yellow cabs are readily available in major cities.
